Saturday, 10 Nov 1962 at Legion Hall in Uptown Butte - Course record disallowed



The current Vets' Day Race course record stands at 15:57 by Butte Central's Chuck Smith from 1952. That record was beaten in today's race, but it was done by a post high school runner who raceadministrators deemed ineligible for official consideration.

Calvin Strobel of Terry representing Butte's School of Mines finished the course one second faster than Smith's record.

The disqualification of Strobel's victory and record time came despite the races' periodic past practice (as recently as 1959) of allowing post high school runners official entry.


The race's recognized winner was Don Brunell of Butte High, who finished in 16:10.
